Note on Alignment:

Original US 66 followed the old Oklahoma postal route between Elk City and Sayre from 1926-1929, when it was replaced by the first paved route (Maps 104-109).

On this map, the green route crossed 5 bridges in the area of the lake, which began as a small reservoir to the east of the roadway. The bridge at the top of the map remains intact. The next structure south is a suspected bridge site, unverified but indicated on a 1954 aerial photograph. In 1970, the reservoir was expanded to become Lake Elk City, submerging the other three bridges. Ruins of the 3rd and 4th bridges were revealed in 2015 during a drought.
