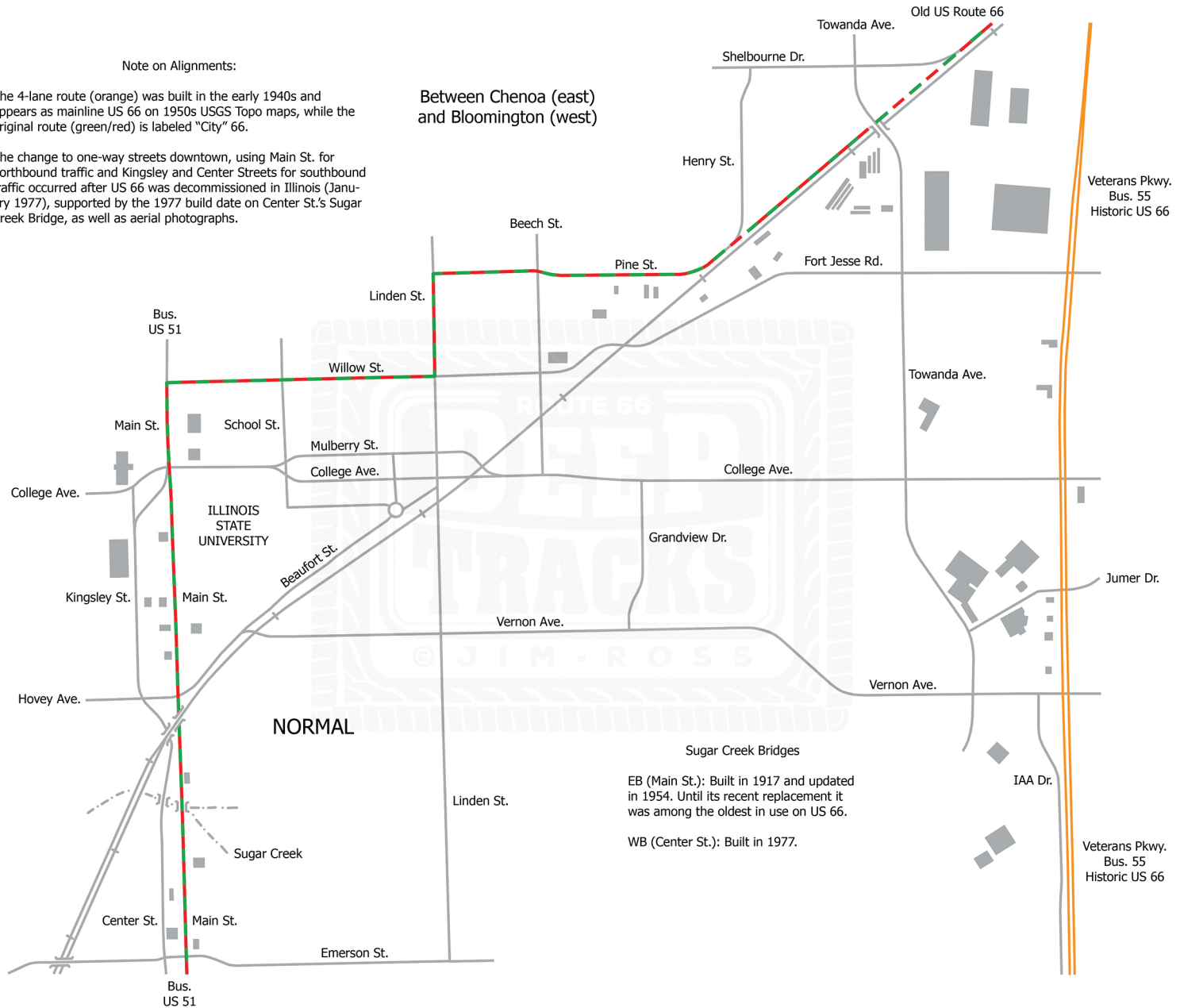


**Note on Alignments:**

The 4-lane route (orange) was built in the early 1940s and appears as mainline US 66 on 1950s USGS Topo maps, while the original route (green/red) is labeled "City" 66.

The change to one-way streets downtown, using Main St. for northbound traffic and Kingsley and Center Streets for southbound traffic occurred after US 66 was decommissioned in Illinois (January 1977), supported by the 1977 build date on Center St.'s Sugar Creek Bridge, as well as aerial photographs.

**Sugar Creek Bridges**  
 EB (Main St.): Built in 1917 and updated in 1954. Until its recent replacement it was among the oldest in use on US 66.  
 WB (Center St.): Built in 1977.
